Romance of the War-Thrilling Adventures of a Young and Beautiful Woman.

Among the many thrilling events of the late war (says the St. Louis Repub-lican of the 7th), none can exceed the adventures of Mrs. Loretta De Camp, the subject of this sketch. Mrs. De Camp, whose maiden name was Roach, was born in the West Indies in 1838, the rate of 50 cents per square. and is now about twenty-eight years of age. She proceeded to Island No. 10, but not being satisfied with the manner in which affairs were conducted manner in which affairs were conducted there, she left and went to Fort Pillow, where ale was elected First Lieutenant in Captala Phillips' Company of Independent Tennessee Caralry. With her company she proceeded to Corinth and purposed to General A. S. Jolinson. At them. reported to General A. S. Jolinson. the battle & Shiloh Captain Philips fell mortally wounded, and the command then devolved on her. While gallantly leading her company in a charge, she was twice wounded and carried from the field.
