ORDER OF PUBLICATION.

MARTHA JONES,
ALSTON C. WHITNEY.

In the Circuit Court for Montgomery County,
as a Court of Equity.

THE object of this suit is to procure a decree for a sale of certain mortgaged premises, situate and lying in said Montgomery county, which were, on the 9th day of October, 1865, mortgaged by a certain Joseph White, deceased, (since deceased,) to a certain Richard E. Harris, which said Mortgage and debt thereby secured are now, by virtue of two several assignments, owned by the complainant, Martha Jones.

The bill states that on said 10th day of October, 1867, the said Joseph Whitney, deceased, conveyed certain Real Estate, which is particularly described in the bill, and containing a tract of land, to the said R. E. Harris, by way of mortgage, to secure the payment of the sum of seven hundred dollars, with interest thereon from the 27th day of July, 1863, in five installments, the last of which fell due on the first day of April, 1871.

That on the 16th day of October, 1867, the said Joseph Whitney, to his credit that he duly executed and recorded, conveyed one half divided half of said mortgaged premises to his son, Alston C. Whitney, the defendant in this cause, will appear by reference to a copy of record.

That the said Joseph Whitney having made and executed his last will and testament in deed form to pass Real Estate, he gave devised and bequeathed all his property, real and personal and moved to his son, Alston C. Whitney, to his credit that he duly executed and recorded the same on the 1st day of August, 1871, leaving said last will and testament unexecuted and unrecorded which said last will and testament was duly admitted to probate by the Orphans' Court and Montgomery County, on the 4th day of July, 1871, and the same appears by reference to a copy thereof with the probate thereon. Filed in an exhibit with said will.

That the said Joseph Whitney left no personal property, and the said Alston C. Whitney, Executor named in said will, declined to take out letters testamentary thereto.

That the said Joseph Whitney, holder of the interest therein, has been joined either to the said Richard E. Harris or Katy G. Benton, or to the complainant, Martha Jones, and that said mortgaged premises, in the hands of the said Alston C. Whitney, are liable to be sold to pay the same.

That the said Alston C. Whitney is a non-resident of this State.

The prayer of the bill is, that said mortgaged premises be sold to pay unto the complainant the sum of \$700, and costs.

It is therefore adjudged and ordered, this 10th day of July, in the year, 1871, by said Circuit Court for Montgomery County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority aforesaid, that the complainant be causing a copy of the order herein to be served in some newspaper printed at Georgetown, in said Montgomery County, on each of four successive days before the 16th day of August next, give notice to the said agent of the object and substance of this bill, and warn him to appear in this Court on the 16th day of September, on or before 12 M. to show cause why, if any, he have not paid the amount of \$700, and costs, as aforesaid.
