Useful Hints.

To PRETERT TERRIPS FLAVORING MILE AND MKAT. When turnips and rutabagas are fed to milch cows and fattening sheep and beeves the milk and butter and meat will have a decided flavor of the roots. This may be prerented by feeding the cows only immediatel after milking; and by changing the feed o fat animals from roots to hay and meal three or four days previous to slaughtering there will be no unplesant flavor in the meat.

SEED CORN .- Ears of corn that have been selected for seed should be hung up in a dry cool place. Taken promiscuously from the crib in the spring, it is more than likely that the majority of the grains will have become injured and unit for seed, and then the white grubs, cut-worms, and crows will be accused of destroying the young shoots, which really never existed. There is no better place t hang up the seed cars than in the top of the crib, where mice or rats cannot reach them and where a constant current of air is passing. Speradisc Mances.—An exchange says. We think it a wrong practice, when hauling out manure in the fall or winter, to place it in the fast place labor is saved. But most important of all is the fact that much of the manure is wasted when placed in heaps. If spread at once, it is more equally divided than it can be afterwards. We once hauled out manure on a field, leaving it in heaps until the hauling was completed. During this time some showers fell. The land was sown to outs next showers fell.
