Mr. Wells also estimates that the permanent accumulations of the English nation for the last 30 years amount to about \$30,000,000.000; those for the United States for the last 250 years amount to about \$25,000,000,000. The difference is owing to the greater intelligence of our masses and superior natural advantages amid which they are placed; while the more received adoption of labor-aveling machinery here, expecially during the last fifteen or twenty years, has also worked in our favor.
