#### Useful Hints.

A New Can for Our Cannate. -Old ingrain or three-ply carpets, however faded or worn. may be turned to good account in the following manner: Ravel out the carpet, and as you do so wind it in balls. When this is done, have ready some scarlet, blue, origreen yarn, which, if the colors of the carpet be vary dull, will help to enlive a them. Next take a long stick, like a yard-stick, and wrap the raveled yarn tightly around it, interspersing it with a little red and green all the way through; when the stick is full, begin to sew it along E. F. Coo's Super Phosphate, open on the other. Now do another and another stickful in the same way, until the carpet is all gone.
