Planting Trees.

Mr. Estrom.—You will please pardon a resident and well-to-do laborer of our progressive town, for suggesting that your remarks in last week's Sentinel, touching the planting of trees on our streets, give to your country readers a very inadequate conception of what is proposed, and of what has been effected by our present Town Commissioners, Messrs. E. H. Hartman and W. H. Rabbitt, in the highly important matter. They have not contented themselves with merely recommending the planting of trees, but have recently purchased from a first-class nursery, and had carefully planted at the expense of the tax-payers of the town, about seventy-five of the most beautiful and popular varieties of street trees.

It is a pity to see that one who has not paid any attention to this interesting subject, can appreciate the comfort, enjoyment, and delight that are in store for those of our people who will live to see these trees fully developed, and lifting their majestic branches to our boulevards, shading our homes, sidewalks, and our streets, from sun and dust, and giving the whole town a noble and dignified appearance.
