A FRIEND TO SIMPLES.

An ingenious Method of propagating Cucumber's for several crops in suc-

cession without sowing them. As soon as there appear several flower beds on a plant, bend the 2d or 3d joint of a branch below the blossom, fasten it firmly in the ground, and cut off the capillary point of the plant. The vegetable speedily takes root, when you separate it from the Parent Stock. Proceed thus with the most vigorous plants; and, as each root has to support only s few fruits with nourishment, you save both labor, to procure a constant succession of Cucumbers, for a number of months, from our sort, which is not so liable to degenerate, as if they were raised from a variety of seeds.
