Pine Creek is navigable at all times when the Susquehanna is. Our immediate settlement is near the state road, and in the vicinity of the place where the C.UNTY Town will, most probably be excelled, i and about three or four miles from Pine Creek. The whole country appears to be well and sufficiently watered. In addition to the above we need enly say. that we confidently expect. that what we much hoped for will be realized-that we shall find the country remarkabiy healthy.


