PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of the Act of Congress passed on the 26th March last, entitled " Ar act supplementary to the act, entitled "An zet relative to the election of a President and Vice-President of the United States, and declaring the officer who shall act as President, in case of vacancies in the chites both of President and Vice-President."-That the amendment proposed, during the last ression of Congress, to the constitution of the United States, respecting the manner of voting for President and Vice-President of the United States, has been ratified by the legislatures of three fourths of the several states, to wit : by these of Vermont, Rhode Island, New York, New Jerkey, Pennsylvania, Meryland, Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, Tei exerc, North Caroina, South Caroli a and i Georgia, and has thereby become volid as pair of the constitution of the United

Supplementary to the act, entitled " An act relative to the election of a President and Vice Presidert of the United States, and declaring the officer who shall act as President, in case of vacancies in the offices both of President und

Vice President." BE it enwied, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, That whenever the amendment proposed during the present fellion of Congress to the constitution of the Unit d St.t s, respecting the manner of voting for President and Vice President of the United atates, in II have been at ned by the legislatures of three-ferrties of the several states the secretary of state thall forthwith cause a notification thereof to be male to the executive of every state, and said also cause the same to be published in at least or newspipers printed in each state in "high the laws of the United States we annually published, he executive assume ty of each state will cause a transcript of the l s id notificate a to be deliver d to the clastors appointed for that purpose, who sould ! first thereafter meet in such itit. te. t e election of a President and Vice President said electors shall have received the said transcript of notification, or allenever they shall meet more than five ders subsequent to the publication of the rat mation of the above mentioned amendment, in one of the newspapers of the state, by the secretary of state, they shall vote for President and Vice Prizident of the United States, respectively in the manner directed by the above mentioned amondment, and having made and signed three certificates of all the evotes given by them, each of which certidicates shall contain two distinct lists, one, ot the votes given for l'resident, and the other, of the votes given for Vice President : they shall sell up the said certificates, -certifying oa each, that lists of all the votes of such state given for President, and of all the votes given for Vice Piesident, is contained therein, and shall cause the said certifica es to be transmitted and disposed of, and in every other respect act in conformity with the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement. And every other provision of the act to which this is a supplement, and which is not virtually repealed by this act, shall extend and apply to every-ciection of a President and Vice President of the United States, made in conformity to the above mentioned

United States. And whereas, the above mentioned a mendment may be ratified by the legislatures of three fourtlis of the states, and thereupon become immediately val.d, to all intents and purposes, as part'of the constitution, on a day so near the day fixed by law for the meeting of the electors in the sevaral states, that the electors shall not in every state be apprised of the said ratification, and may vote in a manner no longer conformable with the constitution, as amended, whereby several states might be deprived of their vote in the election of President and Vice President; for remedy whereof,

Sec '2. Be it further enacted, That the electors who shall be appointed in each state for the election of a President and street.

Vice President of the United States, shall at every such election, unless they shall have received a transcript of the notifica. tion of the ratification of the above mentioned amendment to the constitution, or unless they shall meet more than five days subsequent to the publication of the said ratification by the Secretary of State, in one of the newspapers of the state, vote for President und Vice President of the United States, in the following manner, that is to say: they shall vote for two persons as President and Vice President, in conformity with the first section of the second article of the constitution. And in other respects act in conformity with the provisions of the act to which this act is a supplement; and they shall likewise vote for one person as President, and for one person as Vice President, in conformity with the above mentioned amendment of the constitution; and in other respects act in conformity with the provisions of the first section of this act. But these certificates only, of votes given for President and Vice President of the United States, shall be opened by the. President of the Senate, for the purpose of being counted which shall contain the list or lists of v. tes given in conformity with the constitution, as in force on the day fixed by law for the meeting of the electors, by whom the said votes shall have been given.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That whenever, by the provitions of the second section of this act, it shall be the duty of the electors for any flate, to vote in conformity both with the conflitution, and of the proposed amendment thereto, the executive authority of fuch flate thall cause fix lists of the names of the electors ! of the trate to be made and certifi d, and to be d'divered to the faid electors on or before the day fixed by law for them to meet and vote for Prefident and Vice-President, and the findgelectors thall enclute one of the faid fins in each of the certain ates by them made and fealed, in confirmity to the provisions of this act, and of the att to which this is a supple-
