A. A cheap and expeditious method to make excellent Vinegar.

Take any quantity of ripe apples, (the sweeter the better) mash them as fine as you can, put them into a tub or barrel, (with one head open if a barre!) and let it rem in slightly covered in the irrest, till it frimeries &

smells sharp and sour; then press our the liquor, put it up in a cask, and bung it up. As soon as it settles it will be fit for use. It is best to let your apples be previously kept in the house till they are mellow, before you hegin your operation; let no rotten ones be used, as they would give the Vinegar a bad taste.


