

A cheap and expeditious method to make excellent Vinegar.

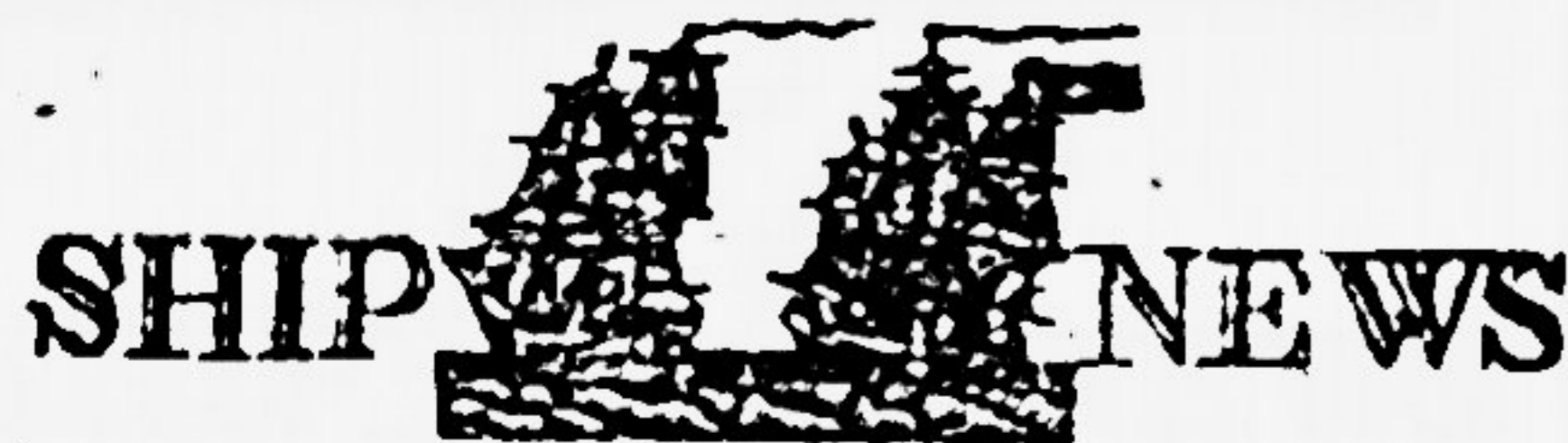
