Elk-Ridge, and as I learn they did not go there,
and have not since heard any thing of them,
the presumption is, that they have absconded or
been kidnapped; if the former, I will give 30
Dollars reward for apprehending and commit-
ting them to any jail in the United States, so
that I get them again; and in the latter case, I
will give One Hundred Dollars for the recovery
of said negroes, and conviction of the perpetra-
tors of so base an act, or Fifty Dollars for
the recovery of the negroes—and in both cases I
will also pay reasonable charges for bringing the
negroes home to me in this city. Lydia is a-
bout 30 years old, a light colored negro, bold
countenance, and sensible and very plausible in
conversation; took with her a variety of cloth-
ing, among others, two suits of dark striped and
clouded nankens, and one suit of black silk, all
