ROBBERY.
150 Dollars Reward.

IN the night of the 16th & 17th instant, a robber introduced himself in the house, No. 159, Bond street, Fell's Point, and took out of a trunk from nine hundred to a thousand dollars, in doubloons, which were secured in a woman's under jacket; a pair of bracelets and necklace of the same pattern, the agrafis cyphered with the letters S.
