That violation of the rights of nations may be regarded as deferred at most, for whenever an open rupture shall take place with either Russia or Sweden, it may be expected that extraordinary step will be immediately taken by the French army.

Bordeaux, 18th Thermidor. (6th August.) Messrs. Humboldt and Bonpland, whose death has been announced in the news papers, are just arrived in this city from Philadelphia, after a most happy passage of 29 days. Being engaged for these five years past in an expedition undertaken at their own expense, for the progress of the science of physics, they have travelled through Oconquit, Amazonia, the kingdom of New Grenada, Quito and the rest of Peru, and Mexico.

Besides the geological collections and the cases of herbs they had already sent to Europe, they have about thirty chests of objects which must be highly interesting, as the countries they come from have been so little visited.
