

PROPOSALS FOR CARRYING Mails of the United States ON THE FOLLOWING POST-ROADS.

Will be received at the General Post Office in Washington, until the fourteenth day of January next inclusive.

7. From Easton, by Hillsboro, Denton, Greenboro and Whiteburg, to Frederick once a week.

10. From Baltimore, by Ellicott's Lower Mills and New Market, to Fredericktown twice a week.

13. From Fredericktown, by Middleburg, Boonville, Hagerstown and Greencastle, to Chambersburg twice a week.

17. From Harford to Bel Air once a week.

20. From Annapolis, by Haddons, St. Michael's, Easton, Cambridge, Vienna, Salisbury, Prince Ann and Snowhill, to Salisbury once a week.

23. From Washington city, by Georgetown, Montgomery, Clark's, to Fredericktown three times a week.

26. From Washington city, by Upper Marlboro and Queen Anne's, to Annapolis twice a week.

29. From Upper Marlboro by Nettingham, Aqueduct, Benedict & Charlotte Hall, to Chaptico once a week.

2. THE Post-master General may expedite the mails and alter the times of arrival and departure at any time.

4. For every thirty minutes delay (unavoidable accidents excepted) in arriving after the time prescribed in any contract, the contractor shall forfeit one dollar.

5. Newspapers as well as letters are to be sent in the mail, and if any person making proposals, desires to carry newspapers, other than those conveyed in the mail...

7. No other than a free white person shall be employed to convey the mail.

10. The contractor for the above routes are to be in operation on the first day of April next and are to continue in force for two years.
