OBSERVATIONS

On the Bo deaux Price Current, published in yesterday's American.

The duties designated in this price current are those levied on goods imported in foreign bottoms. An addition of 10 per cent is imposed on the above duties of imports and exports, as a war tax. All goods free or not rated, pay 25 centimes per quintal, or 15 centimes per 100 francs on their value, both on imports and exports. Sugars, coffee and cocoa, imported in French bottoms, direct from the colonies, if entered for consumption, pay ove-third less than if imported in foreign bottoms. Tobacco imported in French vessels pay one-fourth less. Duties are paid on the gross weight, excepting on the following articles: tobacco, tea, sugar, coffee, cocoa, pepper, drugs and spi-

Entrepots are established at Marseill s, Cette, Bayonne, Bordeaux, Rochede, Nantes, Lorient, St. Malo, Cherbourg, Havre, Ronen, Dunkirk, Oftend and Antwerp, for all kinds of foreign produce, and merchandize not prohibited, which my be re exported in the course of one year, free of duty, except 25 centimes per quintal, or 15 centimes per 100 francs of their value. Tobacco is entitled to an entrepot of 18 months; can only be imported in the leaf, and in vessels above 100 tons.

All goods reported for exportation, that are not landed, but taken away in the same vessel, are not subject either to inward or outward duties.

The productions and manufactures of England and her colonies, are prohibited; and consequently are liable to confiscation. A neutral vessel destined for the ports of this republic must be furnished with a certificate from the French commercial agent at the port of loadening, specifying the nature of the cargo, &c. &c. otherwise she will not be admitted to an entry, but on the express condition of taking a return cargo in the manufactures of France, in value equal to her inward one.
