Toussaint Louverture,
LATE GENERAL IN CHIEF OF THE ARMIES OF ST. DOMINGO.
From the year 1792, until the arrival of Gen. Le Clerc, with an impartial account of his political conduct during, and subsequent to that period, diversified with a variety of circumstances interesting to the citizens of the United States and West India; detailing the actual causes of his imprisonment and death; so which is added, a melancholy and accurate description of the rapacious, tyrannical and inhuman conduct of Gen. Le Clerc, until his death; also General Rochambeau's actions, until the evacuation of that colony; and capture by the British, in the fall of 1803.
