An erroneous statement having been given in the English prints, of the naval engagement to which the following official letters refer, we publish them for the purpose of correcting it.

The Captain de Frigate, Guillet, commanding the frigate La Ville de Mitan. To his excellency, the minister of the marine and of the colonies at Paris.

Monseigneur, I have the honor to inform you that the

frigate La Ville de Milan, which depart. ed from the French fort at Martinique, on The Parioto current on the 27 the same month, in . 28 degrees 22 mit autes morth lat. and 66 degrees 8 wigntil. well long. from the meredian vi Fair, fell in with an English Engate which we observed to avoid us. The next day, in lat. 30, long. 64, we again saw her, purfuing us; being the better sailer she came up with us at 8 o'clock in the morning, the wind at north west; two tier of cannon which we shewed, appeared to be the reason why she desisted from the chase when she came within the distance of three miles. About 3 o'elock P. M. she returned to the charge, and took her position on our larboard quarter, we manceu. vred with our mizen topsail, so as to force her to fight on our broadfide. Now the cannonading commenced, was very brisk and kept up with the greatest spirit. After two hours and an half of oblinate fighting, all the time under sail, the enemy bore away in order to go round the Ville de Milan, who seized that moment to board her on the larboard quarter. Our French seamen effected their boarding and made themselves massers of the English friga:e Cleopatra, commanded by captain Robert

She carries 39 cannon, of which ten are 24 pound carronades on her quarter deck.

The English frigate has lost all her masts, except the mizen mast. During the night after the engagement, we experiented a very heavy sea, and the main and mizeh masts of the Ville de Milan were carried away.

We had 14 men killed, and the enemy 37. The number of our wounded is 12, that of the English 28.

Captain Regnaud was killed towards the end of the action. I was wounded by a ball which passed through my thigh.

We are employed in making jury masts for the two frigates; and it is my intention to steer for the Canaries.


