LONDON, March.1,

SALEM, April 12.

Several vessels, lately arrived, have passed through large schools of fish, on soundings, & sting upon the surface of the water. One vessel was near three hours in clearing them. Captain Duckindorff, arrived at Boston, Love out his boat, and took in several by hand of two kinds. He-thus describes them :--"The Isrge fish 3 feet long, 11 inches across just below the head; 31 inchethick; a flap or comb near the bead, up the top of the back; a small fin the whole length of the brck; nearly a swallow tail; two fins just below the i.ex., n the belly; a fin on each side and neur the head; the head large and tuick; the back, sides and fins of gray, yellow and whire regular speckles; the belly of faint gold color and white; the jaws something I ke a shark's, with large and small teeth."

BOSTON. April 17.
