It likewise carries off the different species of worms with which they are infelled. It renovates, as it were, the whole mass of fluids in the body. It promotes all the secretions, and removes glandular ob. Aruelions 1 and, in many cases, it carries off stiffness in the joints, and other lameness; and, upon the whole, it reflores the body to the highest state of perfection of

which it is capable. But the advantages I have now men tioned that arise to horses from their being out to spring grass, are in a great measure lost to them, if they are allowed to continue through the summer, when the grass becomes too rank, so that they become fat and corpulent: for I would - always have it understood that a fat corpulent borse is by no means fit for active exercises of any k nd, neither can he go , through them without danger to his health and foundness. New hay of any kind. should not be given to horses, more respecially to them that are employed in active exercises, as they feed upon it too greedily and swallow it without chewing . it properly. I overloads the flomach, and at the same time produces a crude watery chyle, which disposes the horses to Sweat muck, and that weakens them greatly -Therefore bay should never be given till the superfluous moisture it contains be dried up which will require som m nthe after it is got in. But for such horses as are employed in very hard exercises, bay should at least be eight or ten months old "- Clark's Farriery.
