"CADIZ, March 25, 1805. Notwithstanding the rigor of the blockade, sundry neutral vessels, with cargoes, have entered this bay. On the 18th a Danish ship sailed from this port with a cargo of falt, and was ordered back by the English which is a proof that they will allow no vellel to sail with such cargoes, and only with ballall of sand or stones

". The ports that are in a state of blockade at this moment, are Cadiz Ferrol and Carthagena; of course the other ports are free. Vice Admiral Sir J. Orde, in fo med the American consul, by letter, on the 11th, that imperious circumstances compelled him to order the blockade of Cadiz to be strictly inforced from that time."

The brig Albion Daggett, and sch'r Midas, Hutchins, bo h arrived at Bolto. Son the 9th ultimo. in 54 days from Marseilles and 38 from Gibraliar. The thip Apollo, of Baltimore, sailed 9 days before for Leghorn and the East Indies. Sailed in company and parted on the 24th of March, off Malaga, with the brig Virginia, for Norfolk.

The brigs Smilax and Dean, of Baltimore, were at Naples the 4th February. The Huron, from Lisbon to this port, was spoken on the 11th inst.

We have been savored by captain Pearson, of the schooner Iris, of Fredericksburg, who arrived here yesterday from . Newport, R. I. with the following particulars.—On the 1st of April left the island of Porto Rico, laden with sugar, coffee and fustick, bound to Norfolk; on the 8th was boarded by a French privateer (Musquito) in lat. 27, 30, long. 71 under the command of Mons. Brouard, who said she was a national vessel; he took capt. P. with his papers and letters on board the privateer. The letters were opened. and the papers declared to be counterfeited Mr. Carter, the mate and a black man were tied up and flogged until they declared that the vessel was from Cape Francois,-The officers and crew were then plundered of every thing, even to incrous Friend, Chamming, hauled out in the clothes on their backs. On the 10th the privateer boarded the brig Mount Vernon, captain Samuel Lowe of Rhode Illand, whom they robbed of 295 dollars, New York. and then put on board captain Pearson, his mate and two boys, together with live from Newbern. prisoners taken in British vessels-Captain Pearson expresses the utmost gratitude to captain Liwe for the friendly treatment he received on board his brig until their arrival.-The above account it will be feen perfectly corresponds with that given in out last.
