Capture of the British Ship Helena. The Elelena of Glalgow, a Britith lett r of marque, commanded by Capt. G. Stewart, sailed from Norfolk for Barbados about the first of January. She had been reported as thipwrecked, - The following is an extract of a letter from the captain to his friend in this place, received y fferday.

Point Petre, Guad. Feb. 17 1805. " I am forry to inform you of the capture of the Heiena, on the 18th inflant, about 3 degrees to windward of Barbados, by the Revolution French privateer of 14 guns and 120 men, after a chose action of zwo hours; during which they made leve ral attempts to board us, but were repul! ed with confiderable lots. Beti 'e their great guns, they kept pouring musquetry into us without intermitsien which disabled the ship very much, wounded one man severely, and drove several others from their quarters Finding it impossible to keep her any longer from b arding us, (having no nettings, and the weather being moderate) I was under the necessity or furrendering .- he privatetr fuffered confideraby in her falls and rigging but they would never let us know how many men | ped. they loft. 



To provide for the trial of facts in the seve at counties of this state, and to alter change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and forms of gover ment as relate to the general court of appeals.

DE it enacted by the general assembly of

D Maryland, That this state shall be divided into six judicial districts in manner and form following, to wit: St. Mary's, Charles and Prince George's counties, shall be the first district; Cacil, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talbot counties, shall be the second detrich; Ca!veri, Anne Arundel and Montgomery crunties, shall be the third district Ca-oline, Dorches'er, Somerset and Wo crater counties, shall be the fourth district; Federick, Washington and Adegany cou ties, shall be the fifth dismofe and Harford counti , hil be the sixth district; and there shall be appointed, for each of the said judicial districte, three persons of integrity and sound legal knowledge, residents of the state of Maryland, who shall previous to and during their acting as judges, reside in the district for which they shall respectively be appointed, one o' whom shall be styled in the commission chief judge, and the other two associate juages, of the district for which hey shall be appointed; and the chief judge, together with the two associate judges, shall compose the county courts in each respective district; and each judge shall hold his commission during good behavior, removable for misbehavior on conviction in a court of law, or shall be removed by the governor, upon the address of the general assembly, provided that two thirds of all the meni-; bersuleach house con cur in sachaddress; and the county couris, so asiaforesaid essablished, abail have; hold and exercise, in the severat counties of this state, all and every the powers, authorities and nis siate now have, use and exercise, and mbich shall be bereafter prescribed by awis and the said, county courts cara-

And be it enacted That, he e shall be a court of appeals and the same that be composed of the chief judges of the several judicial dirricts of the flate. which faid court of appeals shall hold, use and exercise, all and singular the powers authori ies and jurildiction, heretofote held. used and exercised by the court of appeals of this flate, and also the appellate jurisdiction heretosore used and exercised by the general court ; and the faid court of appeals hereby ellablished, shall-sit on the wellern and castern shores for transacting and determining the business of the respective shores, at fuch times and places as, the future legislature of this state shall direct and appoint, and any three onf the fuld judges of the court of appeals shall form a quorum to hear and decide in all: cases pending in said court; and the judge; who has given a decision in any case in the county court, shall withdraw from the bench upon the deciding of the same esse before the court of appeals ; and the judges of the court of appeals may appoint. the clerks of said court for the western and eastern shores respectively, who shall hold their appointments during good behavior, removeable only for misbehavior on conviction in a court of law; and in cafe of death, refignation, disqualification, or removal out of the state, or from their respective shores, of either of the faid clerks. in the vacation of the said court, the governor, with the advice of the council, may appoint and commission a fit and proper person to foch vacant office, to hold the lame until the hext meeting of the faid court 3 and all laws passed after this act shall take effect. Mall be recorded in the office of the court of appeals of the wellern shore.

VI. And built enocted, That all and every part of the conflictution and form of government which relates to the court of appeals and the general court, or the judges thereof, or that is in any manner repuguant to, or inconfillent with, the pravisie ons of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed, abrogated and annulled, upon the confirmation hereof ; provided, that nothing herein contained thall be confirmed so as to authorise the removal of theclerks of the tespective county courts being in commission at the time of the passing of this act, fin any other mede or manner than that prescribed by the constitution and form of government;

VII. And be it enocted. That if this well shall be confirmed by the general affembly. after the next election of delegates, in the first sellion after luch bem election, as the conflitation and form of governmens direcle, that in such case the att alterations and amendments of the coolis tution and form of government thefein contained, shell be taken and confidered. and Thall continue and be valid as Apart of the faid constitution and form of government to all intents and purpoles uny thing in the faid conft tution and form of government to the contrety norwithliand
