Extract of a letter from Lisbon, dated 6 April, 1865.

Your nation is not the only one at war with the Barbary powers, the Algerines have lately done much damage to the Portuguese in the 21 vessels, in consequence of which a fleet composed of two 74 gun ships, and five frigates of 44 guns, left this day to blockade the port of Algiers, &c.

Extract of a letter from Malta dated on board the frigate Constitution, March 1, 1865.

Schooner Nautilus, captain Dent, has just come in, she captured a fine vessel, day with guns and ammunition on board, bound to Tripoli. We sailed from Lisbon on the 10th of February, and arrived at Gibraltar on the 15th. We were in only 6 days making our passage from Gibraltar to this place. The ship's progress was very fast; she has made the rate of thirteen miles an hour since I have been on board.
