To provide for the trial of facts in the several countles of this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and forms of government as relate to the general court aid court of appeals.

DE it enacted by the general assembly of D Maryland, That this state shall b divided into six judicial districts in manner and form to lowing, to wt: St Mary's, Charles and Prince George's counties, shall be the first district; Czcil, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talkot cou ties, shall be the second districh; Ca'vert, Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties, shall be the third district: Cambine, Dorchester, Smirset and Worcester c upties, shall be the fourth districa; Fiedelick, Washington and Allegany counties, shall be the fifth district: Ba imore a d Ha ford counties shah be the sixth dist et; and there shall be a pointed, for each of the said · judicial districts, three persons of integrity and sound legal knowledge, resi dents of the state of Mary'and, who shall perious to and during their acting as judges, reside in the district for which they shall respectively be appointed, one of whom shall be styled in the commission chief judge, a d the other two associate junger, of the district for which they shall be appointed; and the chief judge, together with the two associate judges, shall compose the county courts in each respective district; and each judge shall hold his commission during good behavior, removable for mishehavior on convictim in a court of aw, or shall be removed by the governor, upon the address of the general assembly, first fession after such new election, as the provided that two thirds of all the mem; | constitution and form of government dibers ef each house concur in such aedress | rects, that in luch case this aid, and the and the county courts, so as aforesa destablished, shall have, hold and exercise, in the several counties of this state, all and every the powers, authorities and jurisdictions, which the county courts of this state now have, use and exercise, and which shall be hereafter prescribed by law; and the said county courts established by this act shall respectively hold their sessions in the "everal counties at such times and places as the legislature shall direct and appoint, a d the sal-ries of the said judges shall not be diminished during the period of their continuance in vHice.

Il And be it enacted, That in any suit or act: n at law he reafter to be commirneed or instituted in any county court of this state, the judges thereof, upon suggestion in writing by either of the pa ties thereto, supported by affidavit or other proper evidence, that a fair an impartial trial cannot be had in the county court of the county where such sui or action is depending, shall and may order and direct the record of their proceedings in such suit or action to be transmitted to the judges of any county court within the district for trial, and the judges of such county court, to whom the said record shall be transmitted, shall hear and determine the same in lik manner as if such suit or action had been originally instituted therein; provided, nevertheless, that such suggestion shall be made as aforesaid before or dur ing the term in which the issue or issues may be joined in the said suit or action: and provided also, that such further remedy may be provided by law, in the premises, as the legislature shall from time to time direct and enach.

III. And te it enacted, That if any party presented or indicted in any of the county courts of this state. shall suggest in writing to the court in which such prosecution is depending, that a fair and impartial trial cannot be had in such court, it shall and may he lawful for the said court to order and direct the record of their proceedings in the said prosecution to be transmitted to the judges of any adjoining county court for trial, and the judges of such adjoining county court shall hear and determine the same, in the same ma nner as if such prosecution had been originally insli tuted th rein: provided, that such further and other remedy may be provided by law in the premises as the legislature may direct and enact.

IV. And be it enacted. That if the attorney-general or the prosecutor for the state, shall suggest in writing to any county court before whom an indistment is or may be depending, that the flate cannot have a fair and impartial trial in such court, it shall and may be lawful for the faid court, in their discretion, to order and direct the record of their proceedings in the said prosecution to be transmitted to the judges of any adjoining county court for trial, and the judges of such county court shall hear and determine the same as if such prosecution had been originally inslituted therein.

V. And be it enacted, That there shall be a court of appeals, and the same that! be composed of the chief judges of the several judicial diffricts of the state, which faid court of appeals thall hold, use and exercise, all and fingular the powers, and . thorisies and jurildictions, heretofore Leid, uled and exercised by the court of appeals of this flate, and also the appellate jurisdiction heretofore used and exercised by the general court; and the faid court of appeals hereby established, shall sit on the wellern and eathern fliores for transacling and determining the builness of the refpective shores, at such times and places as the future legislature of this state shall direct and appoint, and any three of the faid judges of the court of appeals shall form a quorum to hear and decide in all cases pending in said court; and the judge who has given a decision in any case in the court, thall withdraw from the bench upon the deciding of the same cale betore the court of appeals; and the judges of the court of appeals may appoint the clerks of faid court for the weltern and eastern thores respectively, who shall hold their appointments during good schavior, removeable only for mulbchavior on conviction in a court of law; and in cafe of death, refignation, disqualification, or removal out of the flate, or from their refpective shores, of either of the said clerks in the vacation of the faid court, the governor, with the advice of the council, may appoint and commission a si and proper person to such vacant office, to hold the same until the next meeting of the find court; and all laws paffed after this act shall take effect, shall be recorded in the office of the court of appeals of the west-

VI And be it exacted, That all and everypart of the constitution and form of government which relates to the court of appeals and the general court, or the judges thereof, or that is in any manner repugnant to, or inconfident with, the provinons of this a..., be and the same is hereby repealed, abregated and annulled, upon the confirmation berect; provided, that nothing herein conta ned shall be construed fo as to authorife the removal of the clerks of the respective county courts being in commission at the time of the passing of this act, .i. any other mode or manner than that prescribed by the constitution and form of gove nment.

VII And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the general affenbly. after the next election of delegates, in the alterations and amendments of the conthtution and form of government therein contained, shall be taken and considered, and shall continue and be valid, as = part of the said constitution and form of government, to all intents and purpoies, any thing in the faid constitution and form of government to the contrary, notwithstand-
