NEW-YORK, May 27,
George Hammeken, Esq., and brother,
who we are informed is appointed by the
King of Denmark, Consul for the Eastern
States, came passengers in the ship Lydia
Capt. Tredwell, from Copenhagen. We are
also informed that Mr. J. F. Eckhart, formerly
Vice Consul at Philadelphia, is appointed by
his Danish Majesty, Consul for the Middle States.

By the authority of Capt. Brown of the
brig Panther, the editors of the New York
Gazette have been put in possession of
Kingston (Jamaica) papers to the 2d inst.,
which complete away the various rumors
of an attack upon Jamaica by the
Toulon fleet.

We have received by the Argus, Montego
Bay papers to the 4th instant from
which we have given interesting marine
intelligence. The Chronicle of the 4th
mentioning that orders had been received
there from the British government, to allow
large supplies to be imported into the
different islands in American vessels
when ever it was thought expedient.
The passengers who went in the brig
Twins, from N. York, has arrived at Falmouth
from Barbadoes, in a schooner which
they had chartered.

By the Panther and Argus, arrived yester-
day, we have received Kingston's news
to the 5th inst. A few days previous to
the sailing of the Panther, from King two
admiral Dices, with six sail of the line
left Port Royal in search of the French
fleet. Off the Coloradoes, Capt. B. was
boarded by a French privateer who robbed
the captain and passengers of their clothes
and every thing valuable on board, leaving
them in the most insulting manner.

The Reynel, a sloop of war had arrived
from a cruise, in which she had fallen in
with a French privateer (late the Lily)

days. Last Saturday, off the Nore, Capt. Male,
the Ranger was boarded by a large
French fleet, 17 vessels, mounting two six
pounders each, and with a long 18 pounder
in midship, 176 twines, and had
110 men, and chiefly Barbados sailors, and
two boatswains. The crew were all
French, Spanish, and Italian people of
colour, with five flags, one of which
they believed to be St. Domingo, and
others to Guadaloupe. They plundered
the ship of every article, and probably a majority
of the crew were sent into the same destination,
that they had been bound to satisfy
the French, and that the long and
dangerous voyage, when the public had
no regard for the safety of the crew.
