The Emperor of the Turke, observing how sealonably the Russians had made prace, by abandoning the provinces they had aken, nd finding how many checks his troops had received, determined to appeale Nader - Khouim was ordered not to advance, and the limits of the Turkish and Persian empires were proposed as the besis of a treaty of peace. The messenger reached Nader while at Tellis. His reply was, We will quench the fire of diffention, by the liquid fir- of death, and make our enemies drink destruction instead of live. We are fixed. Winter and all its horrors, snow topped mountains, and dangerous debles did not oppose; like the sun, fays the Persian, he looked with the same eyes on proud hills and humble vales, and like a Lion he killed, he facked, he humbled at his will. To Derbend he sent families from Teberseran and Dagestan, and victory gave glory to the country, bleffed with his protection. We cannot resule to pive the account wiich follows, in the description of Asia. The great cities of Aran and Armenia, are

Gangia and Erivan, its capital, a large. but unpleasant town without any fine edili e in it, or any other orgament than a number of gardens and vineyards. Some geographers place in Armenia, rities, which we confider as be'o ging to Georgia. Shameur and l'efflis, a city not large, but tolerably elegant. It is washed on the eastern side by the Cyrus. The Cities of Shirvan are Bacu, a port on the Caspian. Shamaunt, a city well known to the Rufsians, and Derbend, or the Barrier, which flands at the foot of Mount Caucafus, and commands the Caspian. This place was called by he antients Caspia Portae, by the Turks, Demir Capi, or the gate of iron, and by the Arabs, Babel bwab, or the important passage. It was antiently considered as the boundary of the Persian Empire, and an old King of Persia built. to the north of it a vall wall, like that of China, which has been repaired at different times, in order to prevent the incursions of the northern savages. Some riffing of this mound are still to be fren, and the cement of it is as hard as marble. This city was once thought so considerable, that the governor of it had the privilege of giving audience in a gold chair, whence the

territory around it was called, Serireddie-
