From the BARBADOS MERGURY.

May 4th .- Dispatches were yesterday received here, brought by his majesty's ship Mercury, captain the honorable D. P. Bouverie, from vice-admiral fir John Orde, dated " his majesty's thip Glory, at sea, April 10th, 1805," communicating the important intelligence of the sudden appearance off Cadiz, of the Toulon fleet, confisting of from 20 to 24 fail, eleven or twelve of them of the line, and the rest heavy frigates. This fleet, it appears, was on the evening of the 9th, ciose off Cadis harbor, where one French ship

of the line, and fix or seven Spanish, were then ready to join them, and three or four more would be in about 24 hours. Whether any roops were on board thete ; rocflips was not known, nor hid the dest ni tion of this force after i's junction had been ascertained, but it was judsed to be to t'e westward: and it was reported that the Spanish thips were bound to the Flavanra.

From this intelligence it is very evident that the fafety of the Wes Indies is again threatened, and that we ought not to be fulled into machivity. The enemy's object, it has been already experienced is predatory wurfare; and that they can effect this with impunity, the elespe of Mellietly fufficiently evinces. According to the latest accounts, this enterprising hero, after having landed the remainder of Lagrange's troops at St. Domingo, and carried his system of destruction and pillage into further effect, has failed from thence, and proceeded, as is confidently faid, to Newto indiand, where we can look for no hing flor of his late wantonness, well correlating with his valiant prototype Richery, who formerly robbed the hibermen there, and burnt their boats.

The Mercury, after the dispatches were del vered. immediately proceeded to fea, and soud to the westward. Sir John Orde, we understand, had also sent advices of the enemy's appearance off Cadiz to England, and olord Nelson, up the Medie serranean.

His majesty's ship Gyane, captain the honorab e G. Cadegin, arrived on Wednet d-y, with the prize privateer Spanish schooner La Justicia, ot 7 guns and 80 men, from Cumana, out eight days, and taken in the latitude of Desseada.


