Ordered. That he act to provide for
the trial of facts in the several counties of
this state, and to alter, change and abol-
ish, all such parts of the constitution and
form of government as relate to the general
court and court of appeals be published
twice in each week, for the space
of three months in the Maryland Gazette
at Annapolis; the American, Tele-
grapher and the Federal Gazette at Bal-
timore; the National Intelligencer; the
Republican Advocate and Bartig's paper at
Frederick Town; Greaves's paper at
Hager's Town, and in Smith's and Cow-
en's paper at Eastern.

AN ACT

To provide for the trial of facts in the
several counties of this state, and to
alter, change and abolish, all such
parts of the constitution and form of
government as relate to the general
court and court of appeals.

BE it enacted by the general assembly of
Maryland, That this state shall be
divided into six judicial districts in manner
and form following, to wit: St. Mary's, Charles and Prince George's
counties, shall be the first district; Cal-
vert, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talbot counties,
shall be the second district; Cal-
vert, Anne Arundel and Maryland
counties, shall be the third district; Cal-
vert, Dorchester, Somerset and
Worcester counties, shall be the fourth
district; Frederick, Washington and
Allegany counties, shall be the fifth
district; Baltimore and Harford counties
shall be the sixth dist. &; and there
shall be a president, for each of the said
judicial districts, three persons, first
gentry and sound in knowledge, residents
of the state of Maryland, who shall
previous to and during the racing
judges, reside in the district for which
they shall respectively be appointed, one
of whom shall be styled in the commis-
sion of judges, and the other who
associate judge, of the district for which
they shall be appointed; and the chief
judge, together with the two associate
judges, shall compose the county courts
in each respective district; and each
judge shall hold his commission during
good behavior, removable for misbehavior
or conviction in a court of law, or
shall be removed by the governor, upon
the address of the general assembly,
provided that two thirds of all the mem-
bers of each house concur in such address,
and the county courts, so as aforesaid estab-
lished, shall have, hold and exercise
in the several counties of this state, all
and every the powers, authorities and
jurisdictions, which the county courts of
this state now have, use and exercise, and
which shall be hereafter prescribed by
law; and the said county courts estab-
lished by this act shall respectively hold
their sessions in the several counties at
such times and places as the legislature
shall direct and appoint, and the salaries
of the said judges shall not be diminished
during the period of their continuance in
office.

VI. And be it enacted, That all and
every part of the constitution and form of
government which relates to the court of
appeals and the general court, or the judges
of the one, or that is in any manner repug-
nant to, or inconsistent with, the provi-
sions of this act, be and the same is hereby
repealed, abrogated and annulled, upon the
confirmation hereof; provided, that noth-
ing herein contained shall be construed
so as to authorize the removal of the clerks
of the respective county courts being in
commission at the time of the passing of
this act, in any other mode or manner
than that prescribed by the constitution
and form of government.

VII. And be it enacted, That if this act
shall be confirmed by the general assembly,
after the next election of delegates, in the
first session after such new election, as the
constitution and form of government
dictates, that in such case this act, and the
alterations and amendments of the constitu-
tion and form of government herein
contained, shall be taken and considered,
and shall continue and be valid, as a part
of the said constitution and form of govern-
ment, to all intents and purposes, any
thing in the said constitution and form of
government to the contrary notwithstanding.

V. And be it enacted, That there shall be
a court of appeals, and the same shall be
composed of the chief judges of the several
judicial districts of the state, which
said court of appeals shall hold, use and
exercise, all and singular the powers, au-
thorities and jurisdictions, heretofore held,
used and exercised by the court of appeals
of this state, and also the appellate jurisdiction
heretofore used and exercised by the
general court; and the said court of ap-
peals hereby established, shall sit on the
western and eastern shores for transacting
and determining the business of the re-
spective shores, at such times and places as
the future legislature of this state shall
direct and appoint, and any three of the
said judges of the court of appeals shall
form a quorum to hear and decide in all
cases pending in said court; and the judge
who has given a decision in any case in the
county court, shall withdraw from the
bench upon the deciding of the same case
before the court of appeals; and the
judges of the court of appeals may appoint
the clerks of said court for the western
and eastern shores respectively, who shall
hold their appointments during good behav-
ior, removable only for misbehavior or
conviction in a court of law; and in case
of death, resignation, disqualification, or
removal out of the state, or from their re-
spective shores, of either of the said clerks
in the vacation of the said court, the go-
vernor, with the advice of the council, may
appoint and commission a fit and proper
person to such vacant office, to hold the
same until the next meeting of the said
court; and all laws passed after this act
shall be recorded in the office of the court
of appeals.

VIII. And be it enacted, That all and
every part of the constitution and form of
government which relates to the court of
appeals and the general court, or the judges
of the one, or that is in any manner repug-

than that prescribed by the constitution
and form of government.

IX. And be it enacted, That if this act
shall be confirmed by the general assembly,
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first session after such new election, as the
