Under the Paris head of April 9, we observe a statement of the votes returned from 112 departments of the French IM-PERIAL REPUBLIC, respecting the hereditary succession of the family of the Emperor, to the Imperial dignity. In order to prove how VERY huppy and well satisfied the French people are with their legal monarch, it needs but be stated that fourteen whole departments voted, unanimously, in favor of Imperial Bonny's proposition, and the other departments, 98 in number, nly produced 2569 revolutionists, who had the hardihood to oppose him. Ingrates, that they are; who, not fatisfied with the glory his Imperial majesty has united with the French name, dared withhold their mite from him, when nearby 4 millions of liege sunjects, hailed him, with loud acclammations of juy, 23 their tovereign Lord.

the prize of 25,000 unlars. A correspondent observes, that an extraordinary misapprehension has taken place in the minds of many of the contributers of the last year to the General Dispensary. They have conceived that the small sum of five dellars, necessary for the support of the charity, would entitle them to have the assistance of the institution for their own families. One would imagine that the very term, A CHARITT, would too much awaken the pride of people in easy circumstances, to induce them to think of profitting by such an establishment. The poor are numerous-many of them must be sick, and when sick, they cannot perform those offices for the rich, or the easy, without which they cannot experience the enjoyments of life.-These considerations will doubtless induce the better conditioned inhabitants, especially at the Point, where the poor are more numerous, and whose labors are there so beneficial, to afford their support to an institution, which is so necessary to promote the good of the community.

According to correct information, it was not certainly known at Paris on the 2d April last, when the Lills in payment of claims covered by the Louisiana cozcention would be drawn, but the commencement of the draughts was expected to take place with very little delay. On this point therefore the intelligence brought by the Alligator, as published in the New York Gazette, is incorrect; and there is little room to doubt that it is so in some other points.

National Intelligencer.

Captain Fowler, of the brig Jane, from St. Croix, is the bearer of very important intelligence. He informs us that accounts had been received there from Grenada, brought by Mr. Cooper, a respectable resident at St. Croix, that seventeen sai! of French line of battle ships, ten frigates, and other vessels, with twenty thousand troops on board, had arrived at Marti nique from Cadiz; and that two or three days afterwards, (about the 25th of Nay) this report was confirmed by captain Fairchild, of the brig James, of New Haver, who arrived at St. Croix in 49 hours from Dominica, with this addition, that the day before his departure, he saw four sail of the line and two transports, pass Domini ca, steering to the northward. This in, telligence, captain Fowler informs us obtained general belief at St. Croix. N. Y. Mercantile Adv.

Captain Graham, in 14 days from Tortola, informs us that while he was getting under way the British sloop of war Heureux, captain Younghusband, came off the harbor, hoisted signals, and fired several guns. He then hoisted his boat with the intention of going on shore, but was met by another from the garrison, to whom he delivered some dispatches, and then returned to his ship, which made sail immediately. On this, all the British merchant vessels made instant preparations for their departure, and three or four of them got out of the harbor while captain G. was in sight. An express had arrived
