AN ACT

To provide for the trial of facts in the several counties of this state, and to bench upon the deciding of the same case alter, change and abolish, all such before the court of appeals; and the parts of the constitution and forms of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals.

DE it enacted by the general assembly of 1.1 Maryland, That this state shall be divided into six judicial districts in manner and form following, to wit: St. Mary's, Charles and Prince George's counties, shall be the first district; Cecil, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talket counties, shall be the second district; Calvert, Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties, shall be the third district; Caroline, Dorchester, Somerset and Worcester counties, shall be the fourth district; Frederick, Washington and Allegany counties, shall be the fifth district; Beltimore, and Harford countics shall be the cixth district; and there shall be appointed, for each of the said judicial districte, three persons of integricy and sound legal knowledge, residen's of the state of Maryland, who shall previous to and during their acting as judges, reside in the district for which they shall respectively be appointed, one of whom shall be styled in the comminsion chief judge, and the other two associate judges, of the district for which they shad be appointed; and the object good behavior, removable for misbeha- and form et government. vior on conviction in a court of law, or VII.
