Ordered, That the act to provide sor" the trial of facts in the several counties of. this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals be published twice in each week, for the space of three months in the Maryland Gazette at Annapolis; the American, Telegraphe and the Federal Gazette at Baltimore; the National Intelligencer; the Republican Advocate and Bartgis's paper at Frederick Town; Greeves's paper at Hagers Town, and in Smith's and Cowan's paper at Easton.

AN ACT To provide for the trial offischs in the several counties of this state, and to alter, change and abolish, all such parts of the constitution and forms of government as relate to the general court and court of appeals.

DE it enacted by the general assembly of Maryland, That this state shall be divided into six judicial districts in manner and form following, to wit: St. Mary's, Charles and Prince George's counties, shall be the first districh; Cacil, Kent, Queen Anne's and Talkot counties, shall be the secend district; Ca!vert, Anne Arundel and Montgomery counties, shall be the third district; Caroline, Dorchester, Somerset and Worcester counties, shall be the fourth district; Frederick, Washington and Allegany counties, shall be the fifth districh: Baltimorej and Harford counties shall be the sixth district; and there shall be appointed, for each of the said jude al district, three persons of integrisy and sound legal knowledge, resident of the state of Maryland, who shall previous to and during their acting as judges, reside in the district for which they shall respectively be appointed, one al whom shall be styled in the commission chief judge, and the other two associate judges, of the district for which they shall be appointed; and the chief judge, together with the two associate judges, shall compose the county courts in each respective district; and each judge shall hold his commission during good behavior, removable for misbeharior en conviction in a court of law, or shall be removed by the governor, upon the address of the general assembly, provided that two thirds of all the memberanfeach house concur in such address; and the county courts, so as aforesaid e:~ tablished, shall have, hold and exercise, in the several counties of this state, all and every the powers, authorities and jurisdictions, which the county courts of this state now have, use and exercise, and which shall be hereafter prescribed by law; and the said county courts established by this act shall respectively hold their sessions in the several counties at such times and places as the legislature shall direct and appoint, and the salaries of the said judges shall not be diminished during the period of their continuance in

II. And be it enacted, That in any suit or action at law hereafter to be commenced or instituted in any county court + apply to the printers. of this state, the judges thereof, upon suggestion in writing by either of the parties thereto, supported by affidavit or offier proper evidence, that a fair and impartial reial cannot be had in the county court of the county where such suit or action is depending, shall and may order and direct the record of their proceedings in such suit or action to be transmitted to the judges of any county court within the district foretrial, and the judges of such county court, to whom the said record shall be transmitted, shall hear and determine the same in like manner as if such suit or action had been originally instituted therein; provided, nevertheless, that such suggestion shall be made as aforesaid before of during the term in which the issue or issues may be joined in the said suit or action : and provided also, that such further remedy may be provided by law, in the premises, as the legislature shall from time to time direct and enact.

III. And be it enacted, That if any party presented or indiciel in any of the county courts of this flate, shall suggest in writing to the court in which fuch profecution is depending, that a fair and impartial trial cannot be had in such court, it shall and may be lawful for the said court to order and direct the record of their proceedings in the said prosecution to be transmitted to the judges of any adjoining county court for trial, and the judges of such adjoining county court shall hear and determine the same, in the same manner as if fuch prosecution had been originally inflituted therein: provided, that such further and other remedy may be provided by law in the premises as the legislature may direct and enact.

IV. And be it enacted, That if the attorney-general or the prosecutor for the state, shall suggest in writing to any county court, before whom an indicament is or may be depending, that the state cannot have a fair and impartial trial in such court, it shall and may be lawful for the faid court, in their discretion, to order and direct the record of their proceedings in the said prosecution to be transmitted to the judges of any adjoining county court for trial, and 400 kegs of white lead in oil, and painters' the judges of such county court shall hear and determine the same as if such prosecution had been originally inflituted therein.

V. And de it enceted, That there flialle a court of appeals, and the same shall be composed of the chief judges of the severat judicial districts of the state, which said court of appeals shall hold, use and exercise, all and singular the flowers, authorities and jurisdictions, heretosere held, used and exercised by the court of appeals of this state, and also the appellate jurisdic tion heretofore used and exercifed by the general court; and the faid court of arpeals hereby effablillhed, fitall fit in the western and eastern shores for trassching and determining the business a the refpective shores, at such times and places as the future legislature of this state thall direct and appoint; and any three of the said judges of the count of appeals thall form a quorum to her and decide in all cases pending in sad court ; and the judge who has given a decision in any case in the county cours shall withdraw from the beach upon the deciding of the fame cafe before the court of appeals; and the judges of the court of appeals may appoint the clerks of Taid-court for the western and eastern shores respectively, who shall hold their appointments during good behavior, removeable only for misbehavior on conviction in a court of law; and in care of death, refignation, disqualification, or removal out of the flate, or from their refpeclive shores, of either of the said clerks in the vacation of the faid court, the governor, with the advice of the council, may appoint and commission a sit and proper perion to fuch vacant office, to hold the fame until the next meeting of the faid court ; and all laws passed after this act shall take effect, shall be recorded in the office of the court of appeals of the wellern fhore.

VI. And be it enacted, That all and every part of the conflictation and form of government which relates to the court of appeals and the general court, or the judges hereof, or that is in any manner repugname to, or inconfillent with; the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby ig. Apply to repealed, abrogated and annulled, upon the consirmation hereof; provided, that noting herein contained shall be construed fo as to authorife the removal of the clarks of the respective county courts bring in commission at the time of the passing of this ael, in any other made or manner than that prescribed by the conflicution and form of government.
