"When told by one of the preachers who attended him, that he had yet half an hour to live, he replied he did not wish the execution delayed, he was then ready to meet death; and the last words he was heard to utter, were 'thank my Jesus I am coming.'" The whole of his conduct was marked with the greatest fortitude and resignation, and made him rather appear to exult than tremble at the approach of death.

From the Merchants' Coffee-House Books.
August 12.
Arrived, brig Betsy & Peggy, Holden, 7 days from Savannah—tobacco—Falls and Brown. On the 7th inst. off Cape Hatteras, brig Commodore Barry, Mead, 3 days from Philadelphia, for Havana.

Also, schooner Antelope, Gould, 27 days from L'Ance-a-Veau, and 10 from Jeremie--W. Pressman. Left at the latter place, ship Leander Cowper, from New York, just arrived from Aux-Cayes, bound to Port-au-Prince; ship America, of Philadelphia, to sail in October; schooner Fanny, Swaine, of and for Baltimore, in 10 days. In lat. 23, was chased the whole of the day by a French privateer.

New-York, August 10.
Arrived since our last,
The brig Integrity, captain Funk, in 25 days from Falmouth, Jamaica. July 20 off Cape Antonio, spoke the ship Anna, of N. York, from Kingston for Havana. The brig Bulah Maria; schooner Nancy; and sloop Maria Antoinette, all sent in from New York, were still at Kingston.

The ship Adriana, Rickatson, 40 days from Cadiz.
Schooner Raynard, Chester, in 15 days from Barracoa. Left the schooner Martha and Mary, Ford, who sailed a few days before for St. Jago, with a full freight, but taken the same day by a Spanish privateer and brought back, cleared; and to sail in 5 days for St. Jago. PRIZES left, sent in while the Raynard was at Barracoa—schooners Potomac, Die, Sophia, & the Eleanor all of Baltimore, for St. Domingo; Commodore Preble, Norton, of Philadelphia; Defiance, Holly's, of Baltimore; Enterprise, Lewis of Alexandria. And the following vessels bound to Jamaica; ship Almy, Crow, of New York; schooner Venus Blisset, of Edenton; and sloop Company, Ackley of Middletown all of which vessels were ordered out by the governor; and the ship Almy, brig Joanno, and sloop Company, made an attempt to get out the day the Raynard sailed, but obliged to put back on account of there a brecre setting in. The brig Savannah, Turner, of Philadelphia for Jamaica, was brought off the harbor on the 13th July and the captain put ashore by the privateersmen; but the privateer was ordered out the next morning, and it was supposed captain Turner was put on board again, and his brig allowed to proceed. The privateer Mobileme, of 2 guns and 40 men, took an English schooner of five guns and 40 men, and brought her into Barracoa on the 15th July. It is supposed the schooner was a British tender. Spoke Aug. 3, lat. 34, the schooner Two Brothers Giles, of Union, 36 hours from Ocracock for Jamaica. August 8, off the Cape of Delaware the schooner Aurora, from New York bound to Wilmington. Sloop Enterprise, Yellowly, in 9 days

from East Florida. Left brig Julian, wrecked off the Reef from Havana--and schooner Hancock, Ross, of Portland, from the Bay of Honduras for New-York, cast away; cargo lost, and people saved.

We are informed by captain Duplex, who came passenger in the ship Hercules, from Liverpool bound to Philadelphia, that the Hercules sailed the 28th June. The ship Neptune, Stanford, for N. York sailed the day before; and several other American vessels at the same time. Spoke, on the 13th ult. north of the Western Islands, in lat. 44, long. 51, ship Hardware, Matalck, 18 days from N. York for London; and schr's Hamilton, 5 days from Boston for Barbados, then in lat. 40, long. 57.
