1000 Dollars Reward.

ON Saturday evening, between dark and ten  
o'clock, the Office of Discount and Depo-  
sit, established in this city, was forcibly opened  
by thieves, and a sum of Money in paper and  
specie, chiefly small change, contained in a  
small wrought Iron Chest, was stolen there-  
from. The villains who perpetrated this daring  
robbery, were not able to succeed, although  
they made the most violent attempts, to pen-  
etrate the vault; all they effected was to bear off
