Forty one ships, 62 brigs, 2 snows, 2 barques, and 67 schooners, are now registered in the district of Newburyport.

The Legislative Council of New Orleans have passed an act for instituting an University within that territory.

Two inward bound ships were captured on Monday last off Sandy Hook, by the two British vessels of war, which are now blockading the port of New York.

Gen. Moreau has been waited on, in the most respectful manner, by the principal characters in Philadelphia; and has accepted an invitation for a Public Dinner, to be given in October next. He was to depart from Philadelphia, for his seate late Robt. Morris's, at Morrisville, opposite to Trenton, on the Delaware.

The schooner Hannah Maria, Sorenson, from Porto-Bello, for Baltimore, with specie, was detained by the frigate Diana, on the 22d June, and captain S. remained on board the frigate on the 3d, instant.

Cuptain Brock, arrived at New-Bedford from England, informs, that on the 11th August, (in about lat. 42, long. 61) he saw a first-rate ship of war, supposed tobe English, with a jury main and mizen mast, in tow of a frigate, standing to the northward, and probably, from their course, bound into Halifax. Captain B. passed within bout 4 miles of them—they shewed no olors.

On Friday last, Perry Spencer and Edward Lloyd, Esqs. were elected by the Directors of the Farmers Bank, for Easton and Talbot county, in the vacancies occasioned by the President and Cashier. Samuel Groome, was appointed teller; and John Harwood, discount clerk, for the Eastern Shore—the other offices are yet to be filled. (Raston Star.




