BAYONE, June 18.
A rich frigate belonging to the Philip-
pine Company has arrived at Cadiz from
Canton, without having seen a single En-
glish vessel. It is hence to be concluded
that the English commerce with China is
not so active as they pretend; that their
naval force is employed in defence of India,
and that their apprehensions of Admirals
Lincol and Hantsinek, excited by their
captures from them, have already sensibly
diminished their trade.

York, was captured off the Hook on Sun-
day last, by the British frigate Cleopatra,
