This ship lost her boat's crew there, and came near being captured by the islanders who mode a desperate attempt against her. The account of the loss of the Portland is given on the authority of the Malay woman. the great Southern Ocean, ought to be always on their guard against the designs Salem Reg. of the natives.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR LORDSHIPS, In obedience to your Lordships directions, signified to us by Mr. Fawkener, we have taken into consideration the petition of Thomas and Isaac Littledale, setting forth that on the arrival of the Ameican ship Leda, Williamson, master, at the port of Liverpool from New-York, with a cargo of flour and staves, the entry of the said cargo had been objected to on the ground that the master of the said vessel (who is a native of Scotland) had not become a citizen of the United States previous to their independence, and that the said vessel could not therefore legally import the said goods into this kingdom for home consumption according to the terms of the act of the 37th of his majesty, ch. 97. And we have the honor to report our opinion to be under the authority of the case of Wilson versus Maryat in the King's bench in 1798, and afterwards in the Exchequer chamber in 1799, that Williamson having become a citizen of the United States, and having (as it is sto be presumed) a bona fide residence there, is qualified to be the master of an American ship, so as to entitle such ship legally to import goods into this country under the statute referred to.


