MANIFESTO OF RUSSIA, Alluded to in the Note of the Emperor of Ger-many, published in this paper yesterday. [Translated for the N. Y. Mercantile Advertiser.] Copy of the Declaration transmitted by Count de Rasoumowsky, Ambassador of his Imperial Majesty of all the Russias.

It would be superfluous to retrace here the motives which induced his majesty the Emperor of all the Russias to recall the plenipotentiary whom he had sent, in concert with his Britannic Majesty, to treat for peace with the chief of the French government. These motives are too just and too evident not to be appreciated by all Europe. They have been expressed in the note transmitted to the ministry of his Prussian Majesty by M. de Novoziloff, the 28th June (10th July) and the resolution they had provoked is but a consequence of the same sentiments and principles which have constantly induced his Imperial majesty to employ his assiduous cares for the re-establishment of general tranquility.

His Imperial Majesty, however, cannot, in the mean time, dissemble the probability that a conduct on the part of the French government similar to that which has already compelled the emperor to retract his first steps towards a negotiation for peace, will render ineffectual that which Austria proposes to renew.

To adhere to the request of renewing the negotiations for peace, interrupted by the recall of M. de Novoziloff, and to proceed thereon as soon as the chief of the French government shall have manifested a similar disposition. To cause two armies of 50,000 men each, immediately to advance towards the Danube through Galicia, with the view of combining with the negotiations for peace a powerful armament of mediation and observation, calculated to prevent future encroachments during the work of pacification, and to guarantee at its issue, Austria and the neighboring country from all attack on the part of France.

His Imperial Majesty invites formally his Austrian Imperial Majesty and King to join in the measures he has adopted; and the undersigned is authorized to act in concert with his ministry upon every thing that may relate to this important object. The following Communication was made to the City Council by the Mayor, at the commencement of the present extra-session:— Gentlemen of the City Council, IN consequence of receiving the enclosed letter from a company associated for the purpose of introducing a permanent supply of water into the city of Baltimore, requesting to know, "whether the corporation will require any, and what quantity of water, to be delivered for the public use of extinguishing of fires, that the pipes may be prepared and laid adequate to that demand," I have considered it incumbent upon me to call you together, that you may have an opportunity of deciding thereon.

At the last session of the city council, a resolution passed, authorising the mayor and the president of the first and second branch of the city council, to cause to be laid before the general assembly of Maryland, a remonstrance in behalf of this corporation, against a law passed by the general assembly, whereby the city corporation are deprived of funds granted to the city of Baltimore, by the charter of incorporation, and to petition the legislature to reinstate the said funds in the city of Baltimore; and likewise to petition for certain alterations in the act of incorporation of this city.

By captain Deagle's Packet from Norfolk, arrived yesterday, we received, from our correspondent, Norfolk papers to the 15th inst. They furnish European Intelligence, a few days later than the arrival at N. York—of which, the following summary, extracted from the Ledger, with the subjoined extracts from French papers, form the principal articles.

Of the armies—their movements will be found in the succeeding columns. The French army it will be seen had crossed the Rhine in three places, and is commanded by the emperor Bonaparte in person, who it will be observed had arrived at Strasburg. The Austrian army had been prompt in entering Bavaria, and was animated by the presence of the Emperor of Austria.

Diplomatic relations do not appear to be entirely broken off between France & Austria, as by the latest accounts it will be seen that the French ambassador was still at Vienna, and we do not perceive after a careful examination, that the Austrian minister had quitted Paris. Of peace—some efforts were still making by the king of Prussia, for its preservation, but it was thought without any prospect of success.

The Helvetic republic, have received assurances from Austria, that her neutrality will be respected. Of Sweden and Denmark, we do not perceive any thing very remarkable, except, that the former power is said to have entered into a treaty of subsidy with G. Britain and Russia, by which Sweden & Russia are to furnish each 24,000 land forces. The king of Prussia has earnestly invited the king of Denmark, to unite with Saxony and Hesse, in measures to maintain their neutrality.

Translations from French papers received at the office of the Public Ledger, by the ship Eisen, captain Smith, in 38 days from Bordeaux: PARIS, September 26. His excellency the minister for foreign affairs left Paris to repair to Strasburg for the purpose of being near the Emperor.

The Tribune held a public sitting to-day. Mr. Freville on the conclusion of a report of the committee, to which a communication had been referred of the government, relative to the invasion of Bavaria by the Austrian armies, proposed to decree that an address should be presented to his majesty the Emperor and king to avow the devotion of the nation to his chief, of its gratitude towards him for all the personal sacrifices he has made for the maintenance of peace, &c. This proposition was unanimously adopted.

His excellency Marshall Massena, Commander in chief of the army of Italy, has established his headquarters at Valleggio. He reviews the different corps which successively arrive. On the 10th, the following proclamation was put upon the order of the day: "Soldiers of the army of Italy, His Majesty the Emperor and King has appointed me your Commander in Chief. It is gratful to me to see again my ancient companions in arms, and to find in them the sentiments which I knew them to possess, attachment to discipline, and devotion to their duty: I shall always speak to them in the language of fraternal sentiments, and it is a pleasure to me to think that they will know how to answer it, if the political circumstances oblige His Majesty the Emperor and King to give the signal of battle, in spite of the desire he has constantly manifested to maintain peace; Soldiers! you will remember that you are upon a field of battle, illustrated by his victories, and that at every step we shall find traces of his magnanimity and of his genius.

The two banks of the Adige are now occupied by considerable forces. The fortifications of Mantua, lately inspected by the Marshal, have been found in such a state as to be looked upon as impregnable. LEMBERG, Sept. 14. To the different generals, we have announced as having commands in the two Russian armies, under M. D'Abrazin, are added, the Count de Buxhorden governor of Riga, and the generals of Infantry Melschior, and Guleints, and the Count de Tolstoy, the military governor of St. Petersburg.

The Prussian frontiers are inaccessible to the Russian army, according to the declaration of his Prussian majesty, maintain a strict neutrality, and also by the large armies which cover the Prussian frontiers. The Russian general's have been compelled to avoid the Prussian dominions in Poland; four columns of the Russian army have in consequence, defiled at Ruzs, towards the Eastern frontier Galicia, and press forward to Moravia; a part will pass near Pulaw, the others approach Cracovia, and our walls.

The French troops of the army of Hanover arrived yesterday in the vicinity of this place. The general in chief marshal Bernadotte, has his headquarters about a league and a half from this place. Yesterday afternoon the senate assembled to deliberate upon a demand of the French general for a certain number of rations. The third division of French Batavian army has arrived at Colbentz.

The first division of the French Batavian army, which has arrived at Mazence, is to pass the Rhine tomorrow the 25th, and will arrive the same day at Frankfurt, and it is presumed will form a junction with the army of Hanover, corps of which are daily arriving in our vicinity, after which it is probable, they will take the rout for Aschaffenburg and Wurtzburg. The general Kellerman arrived here yesterday, from the headquarters of the general in chief marshal Bernadotte, who is expected here tomorrow. The Austrian army which had advanced into Bavaria, has formed a junction with the Austrian corps assembled near Bregentz. We wait with extreme impatience and anxiety, the result of the mission of M. de Meerfeldt to Berlin, and that of the comte de Haugwitz to Vienna. These are, perhaps, the last efforts of Prussia to prevent hostilities. September 25. The first division of the French Batavian army which yesterday crossed the Rhine, halted last night at Welscher Singingen; this morning it continued its march to Frankfurt. The second division will arrive this evening at Frankfurt. The troops of the army of Hanover are to pass the Mein on the side of Ilanau, for which purpose a bridge has been constructed at that place.
