FRANCIS JOHONNOT.

Georgetown, October 29, 1805.

"I hope those in Baltimore, who mean to
adventure in the Tontine, will make their sub-
scriptions in November, and the earlier in that
month, the more agreeable it will be. I want,
if possible, to have the whole completed by the
first of December, that I may have one month to
employ in arranging every thing relative to
this institution, in a way, so clear, as to avoid
the possibility, at least the probability, of dis-
cussion hereafter. You know that, at the first of

December every share is to be reckoned new
upon state life, which cannot afford to be

changed.

I wish, indeed, by attention be-
forehand, to avoid everything like the necessity of
alteration or even variation after arrival. I
make up, in particular, in regard to the description of
the lives chosen for the Stock to be filled up.
