Translation of a proclamation of the elector of Bavaria to the Bavarians.

BAVARIANS!

At a moment when I was solely occupied with your prosperity, when I fore-saw no danger, I was forcibly separated from you.

Austria, for the preservation of which the generous blood of the Bavarians has so often flowed, had conceived perfidious designs against you and against me. Your sons, my brave soldiers, were demanded with menaces, to be disseminated in the Austrian army, and to fight against a power which has at all times protected the independence of Bavaria.

That the Bavarians were no longer to fight for their country, but for foreign interests: thus the very name of the Bavarian army, was to have been destroyed.

My duty, as a prince, and as the father of a faithful and independent people, must have led me to repel propositions so dishonorable for the nation, and to maintain with firmness the neutrality of my states.

I still flattered myself with the hope of seeing accomplished the most ardent of my wishes—the repose of my country.

The negotiations upon this head, were not yet broken off, when Austria, faithful to the system of annihilating the independence of Bavaria, violated the most sacred treaties, made her army cross the Inn, and treated you as the inhabitants of a conquered country.

The most enormous requisitions were made; you were deprived of the most necessary instruments of your industry, even of those of your agriculture; your fields were laid waste, your cattle carried off by force; you were inundated by a depreciated paper currency; even a great number of your sons were constrained to serve under the standards of Austria.

After so perfidious an invasion, after such unheard of outrages, my dignified command to me, as prince and protector of the nation to take up arms, and to deliver the country from its oppressors.

The emperor of the French, the natural ally of Bavaria, flies to our succour, with his intrepid warriors, he comes to avenge us; already your brethren in the ranks of these traitors, accustomed to victory, and already we see the dawn of our safety.

Bavarians, who patiently bear the evils with which the enemies of your country overwhelm you; remember your prince who knows your sufferings, who shares them, and who cannot support the idea of being separated from you, but in the persuasion that in preserving his individual liberty, he has secured to himself the means of acting with an absolute independence for his dear and faithful subjects.

Our good cause is under the protection of a just God, and of a courageous army, commanded by an invincible hero.

Let the rallying-word of every Bavarian be his prince and for his country. Wurzburg, 10th Oct. 1805.

From the Merchants' Coffee-House Books.

January 6.

The Jane arrived yesterday. Sailed from Bordeaux 28th September—Left there, ship Merchant, Wyer, of New-York, to sail in 10 days; Protector, captured, of do, in 15 days; Active, Bryan, of Salem, uncertain. About 14 days

since in long, 73 1-2, spoke ship Amity, from the Isle of France, for New-York, who informed us she had spoken the Merchant off the Cape of Good Hope, bound home; and that the ship Hebe, of Baltimore, from Mocha, had arrived at the Isle of France, and would sail in 26 hours after her. Heard at Bourbon, that the ship Ann, Rutter, from Baltimore, arrived at the Isle of France about the 20th September. The British squadron had not made their appearance off the Isle of France, for some days prior to the sailing of the Jane.

Arrived, ship Stratford, Hancock, 25 days from Trinidad, Cuba—logwood and sassafras—Van Kapff and Brune. Spoke nothing.

The brig Joseph, Beard, from Saint Sebastians in the bay.

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
