THE superior pleasure derived from unfolding the infant mind; the flexibility of early youth; the force of first principles and habits; and the difficulty of correcting more advanced age, are the reasons which have induced the subscriber, to wish to confine his labors to so young a part of the community. The advantages resulting from associating together, boys of nearly the same age, must, he conceives, be obvious to every one: thereby any number may be more effectually taught; greater emulation will be produced, and their morals rendered less liable to be corrupted.
