Union Bank, at Boston-Five dollar bills :- They are executed entirely with a pen, and can easily be distinguished from the true ones; but few in circulation.

Massachusetts Bank, at Boston-Ten dollar bills, a good imitation of the true ones; paper lighter, sew in circulation.

New Bedford Bank-Nine dollar bills, hard to distinguish from the genuine bills, excepting in the motto, " Peace to the world." In world the 1 & d is in a shade in the counterfeits. The true bills only the d. Paper more spungy and whiter than the original.

Maine bank, Portland-Five, Seven and Nine dollar bills are counterseited. Some of the nines are dated March 16, 1803, & are hard to distinguish from the true bills. The seven are dated March 4, 1804, and are also well imitated.
