Longitudes at Sea,

The following are amongst the methods published in London, for the above purpose, since the beginning of the present century:— 1st. A Lunar Chart, the only one in this city. 2d. A projection of two lines only. 3d. Trigonometrical calculations. 4th. A variety of formula's, simplified by alphabetical order, and marginal references to rules.
