Longitudes at Sea,

FOUND, if not exactly, at farthest, within five miles, by a process, which, after ten days' instruction, may be performed, in about fifteen minutes.
The following are amongst the methods published in London, for the above purpose, since the beginning of the present century:—
1st. A Lunar Chart, the only one in this city.
2d. A projection of two lines only.
3d. Trigonometrical calculations.
4th. A variety of formulae, simplified by alphabetical order, and marginal references to rules.
