"After a tedious passage, and experiencing much bad weather in coming down the China Seas against the southwest monsoon, through what is called the inside or Paracel passage, we arrived in Malacca Roads on the 2d October, from whence we sailed on the 4th. Left in the Roads, ship Lancaster of 64 guns captain Fothergill, and three of the company's ships, the Ocean, Windham, and Earl Howe, all bound to China, waiting the arrival of the company's ships under convoy of Admiral Trowbridge, from Rulo Penang, hourly expected. Off Achien head we experienced very bad weather for nearly twenty days, the winds blowing very hard from W. N. W. to W. S. W. and a current against us.

PHILADELPHIA, March 31.

Between the hours of 3 and 4 o'clock, on Sunday morning last, the counting house of Daniel W. Cox, Esq., on the south side of Walnut, just above Fourth street, was discovered on fire, which was entirely destroyed. The building on the west occupied by Mr. Rhodes, shared nearly a similar fate, and that of Mrs. Malone, was considerably injured. On the east side a work shop belonging to Mr. Hance, a stable and a back building attached to the house of Edward Burt, Esq. on Fourth street, were also much damaged.

We make the following extract from the [London] Morning Chronicle of January 3rd. As this is the print which has for a long series of years possessed the confidence of the Whigs of Great Britain, and been the organ of their sentiments, the opinions it announces, justify a hope that like sentiments are entertained by the new administration, and more especially Mr. Fox:

(National Intelligencer.)

"We this day insert a copy of the speech of the President of the U. S. of America on the opening of Congress. It states, strongly, the complaints of the Americans respecting the depredations committed on their trade upon their own coasts, and states that measures had been adopted to repress such outrages, which appear mostly to have been done by vessels without commissions, or exceeding their commissions. The disputes with Spain about Louisiana are mentioned, and the whole of the case between the two powers is to be laid before Congress.

"The part of the speech which will be found most interesting here, is that which alludes to the capture of American vessels by our ships, on the ground of their aiding the enemy. From the attention we have had time this day to bestow upon it, we are inclined to think that, both from the disposition of the President and the point he states to be in dispute, the matter may be amicably adjusted. It never can be pretended, nor do we believe is pretended, by this country, that we have a right to prevent neutrals carrying on all that commerce with enemies which we permit to ourselves during war. We cannot with justice accuse others of aiding the enemy if we do the very things ourselves which constitutes that aid. But it is probable, however, that the Americans will claim a much greater latitude of neutral commerce.

"The president, in the present circumstances, recommends putting the coast in a state of defence, and preparing the public force by sea and land for action, if necessary."

Yesterday (says the Salem Gazette of the 24th ult.) we had a cold Snow-Storm for the most of the day; the wind violent from the northward and eastward. The snow lies several inches deep.

Caramalli; which shall be considered as in full satisfaction for all claims he may have against the United States.

He had lived long enough to give the circle in which he moved an example of one of those very rare assemblages of talents and virtues which Providence now and then exhibits to rescue the human character from a degradation to which a depravity too general would otherwise condemn it: If he had vices, or even follies, they were known only to a merciful God; his friends and acquaintance knew him without spot and without blemish. His talents rather solid than splendid, his information more correct than diffuse, his disposition mild, unobtrusive, but yet firm; an integrity that no party ever suspected, and a diligence that ill health could not repress, marked him peculiarly for the judicial character, and rendered him an ornament and blessing to society. His remains were next day deposited in the burying ground of the Protestant Episcopal Church, of which he was a devout member, attended by a numerous concourse of respectable strangers, among whom his character and exhausted health had excited respect and sympathy.
