

AN ORDINANCE For regulating and adjusting Weights and Measures used within the city and precincts of listimore

D have bure i and ordained by the Major and Dairy Correr of Bullion or, That the mayerbe, and he is hered y wather sed and required to procure correct and accurate standards of all weights and measures, established by law for Bait above county, and the same to have adjusted whenever necessary; and that three persons be appointed within the city, keepers of the said star tards, whose duty it shall be sately to keep and preserve the same, and to perform the several duties presented by this er any other or linance of this corporation respecting acights and measures, who before they enter u on the duties of their appointment, shall give bond to the mayor and city council of Baitimore, in the penal sum of one thousand dollars, conditioned for the faithful discharge of all the duties appert imng to their office; . and one of the said keepers shall be the keeper of the standards of weights, another the keeper of the standards of liquid measures, and the third, the keeper of the standards of dry and

Sect. 2 And be it enacted and ordained, That

within three months after the said stanfards

are precured, and the keep is appointed, of

which the mayor shall cause notice to be given

in the several newspapers of the city, all

weights and measures used within the city or precincts of Baltimore, in the vending of articles, shall be regulated and adjusted by the said standard ke pers, under a penalty not exseconding twenty dollars, to be paid by the persin or persons, owning or using the same, and when adjusted, shall be by the said standard keepers, branded or stamped with the 1 fers . S. meaning thereby, Baltimore Standard, in such manar and on such parts of the said weights and measures as in his judgment shall be most lasting and effectual in preventing and detecting fraudulent practices or impositiat the premises, on terms which will then be ons in the use of such weights or measures. And the like examination and adjustment s' all be repeated once in each year, and the branding or stamping renewed when recessary under a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars. Sec. 3. And be it indicted and ordained. That from and after the indicat the said three months, the weights and measures examined, adjusted and branded or stamped as aforesaid, and no others shall be used within the city or precincts of Baltimore, in the vending of articles or merchandise directed by law to be or usually sold by weights or measures, under a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars, and from and after the same period, all articles sold within the precincts of Baltimore, and usually sold by weight or measure, or by law directed so to be, shall he sold by the weight or measure or storesaid, as the case may be, under a penalty not ex-

> ceeding twenty dollars. Sect. 4. And be it enacted and ordained, That if any weights or measure which shall have been adjusted agreeably to the provisions of this ordinance, shall be broken, injured, altered or changed, and found in the use of any person within the city or precincts of Baltimore, every such person shall forfeit and pay twenty dol-

lars for every such offence. Sect. 5. And he it enacted an lordained. Tat the said standard keepers shall respectively have and receive as a compensation for the discharge of the duties required of them, the following sums, to wit:

For every bushel measure, twelve and an half For every half bushel measure, ten cents: For every peck and half peck measure, ten.

For every five gallon measure, ten cents: For every gallon or half gallon measure, six and a quarter ren s:

For every quart or pint measure, three cents : For every half pint, gill or half gill measure, three cents: For every fifty six pound weight, six and a

quarter cents:

For every twenty eight pound weight, six and a quarter cents; For every fourteen or seven pound weight, six

and a quarter cents: For every set of weights, from four pounds to half an ounce, twenty five cents: For every single weight under seven pounds,

four cents: For every yard measure, six & a quarter cents: To be paid by the person requiring the same to be adjusted.

Sect 6. And be it enacted and ordained, That the standard keepers shall return upon outh or affirmation to the register, annually, a statement of the money they may receive in the performance of the duties prescribed by this ordi-

Sect. 7. And be it enacted and ordained. That

all scale beams used in the vending of articles in the city of Baltimore, or the precincts thereof, shall be adjusted and stamped by the keeper of the standards of weights, as weights are directed to be stamped; and any person using scale beams in the city or precincts, not adjusted and stamped as herein directed, shalk forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty dollars, for each and every offence: and the said standard keeper shall be entitled to receive as a compensation for every scale beam, not exceeding 18 inches, twelve & a half cts. for every scale beam above eighteen inches and not exceeding thiriy six inches, eighteen and three quarter cents; and for very scale beam above thirty six inches, twenty five cents, to be paid by the person for whom the same shall be adjusted as
