ACHILLES,
Of about 166 63-95 tons burthen, then built under the inspection and direction of Mr. G. Livingston, of Poughkeepsie—all her plank, whales, knees and oak timber, have been well water-seasoned and dried before they were used, (which management has heretofore, on a vessel built at the same place, and by the same person, insured a duration of more than 18 years, without a single graving piece in either whales or bottom, although owned and used in the West-Indies about 15 years of the time.) Her two lower rudder hinges are copper, as are the spikes at her hook ends; all her butt bolts and iron spikes are composition covered, so that she is ready for coppering.

The Achilles has been one voyage to the W. Indies, and is, by the captain and mate who sailed in her, supposed to be not only the fastest sailing vessel they ever met with, but one of the best of sea boats, carrying her spars and canvass at least equal, if not superior to any other vessel they have ever seen. When going out, although very deeply laden, she made ten miles an hour close haul on the wind; and returning, although her bottom was very foul, in 23 hours from opposite Cape Charles light-house, directly E. she ran so as to bring the light Louse at Sandy Hook, directly W. a distance very considerably beyond 300 miles; including the trais she made in her course, the average run was between 13 and 14 knots an hour.—Enquire of

Information to Travellers.

THE subscribers beg leave to inform the public, that on the 1st day of April next, a new, expeditious & convenient line of stages, will be established between the cities of Philadelphia and Washington—to run in the following order of time and place:

A stage, with the mail, will leave Brenton's wharf, in Wilmington, every Monday & Wednesday at 5 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Chester Town, early in the evening on the same day.
A stage with the mail, will leave Chester-Town on every Tuesday and Thursday at 5 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Rock Hall by early breakfast.

A comfortable and fast sailing packet, with the mail will leave Rock Hall on every Tuesday and Thursday at 8 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Annapolis, with a favorable wind, in the course of two and a half hours, at any rate, in the course of the same day.

A stage with the Eastern Shore of Maryland and Delaware mails, will leave Annapolis on Wednesdays and Fridays, and arrive at Washington and George Town on the same days.

The stage will leave M. Laughlin's Hotel, in George Town, and Stelle's in Washington, on every Thursday and Sunday, at 5 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Annapolis on the same days.

A packet will leave Annapolis on Mondays and Fridays, at 8 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Rock Hall on the same days, in time for the stage to proceed on to Chester Town on the same evenings.

The stage will leave Chester Town on Tuesdays and Saturdays at 5 o'clock A. M. and arrive at Wilmington on the same days; from whence a stage runs to Philadelphia every day.

One of the subscribers, likewise begs leave to inform the public that he is now established at the ancient and well known ferry, Rock Hall and has provided good, safe, and commodious packets, fitted up in the neatest manner for the accommodation of passengers: that a large and comfortable packet will leave Rock Hall, for Baltimore (on the same days) at 9 o'clock A.
