When going out, although very deeply laden, she made ten miles an hour close haul on the wind : and returning, although her bottom was very foul, in 23 hours from opposite Cape Charles light-house, directly E. she ran so as to bring the light Louse at Sandy Hook, directly W. a distance very considerably beyond 300 miles ; including the travis she made in her course, the average run was between 13 and 14 knots
