First, At Niagara, Detroit, Michilimackinac, Fort Wayne, Chicago, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed...

Second, At South-West Point, Tullahoma, Knoxville, Nashville, and within the Cherokee nation between Tennessee and Georgia...

Third, At the garrison near Vincennes on the river Wabash, at Fort Massac, New Madrid, Chickasaw Bluffs, Arkansas, Natches, and Fort Adams...

Fourth, At St. Louis, St. Charles, Kaskaskia, Cahokia, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed...

Fifth, At New Orleans, Barataria, Point Canpee, Oachita, Natchitoches, Appleton, Atakapa, Fort St. Stephens, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed...

Sixth, At Fort Mifflin, Carlisle, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited within the territory of Orleans, or in the county of Washington in the Mississippi territory...

Seventh, At Charleston, Rocky Mount, on the head waters of the Santee, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited...

Eighth, At Norfolk, and at any place or places where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of Virginia.

Ninth, At Fort Mifflin, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of Maryland and the district of Columbia.

Tenth, At Fort Mifflin, Carlisle, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of Pennsylvania, east of the Mountains, and within the states of New Jersey, and Delaware.

Eleventh, At Pittsburg, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of Pennsylvania, west of the Mountains.

Twelfth, At Fort Jay, West Point, Albany, Stonewall, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of New York, Niagara and its dependencies excepted.

Thirteenth, At Fort Trumbull, Fort Wolcott, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the states of Connecticut, Rhode Island and Vermont.

Fourteenth, At Fort Independence, (Boston harbor) and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited, within the state of Massachusetts, the town of Springfield, and the district of Maine, excepted.

Fifteenth, At Portsmouth, Portland, and at any place or places, where troops are or may be stationed, marched, or recruited within the state of New Hampshire and the district of Maine.

Sixteenth, Proposals will also be received as aforesaid, for the supply of all rations, which may be required for the use of the United States, from the 1st day of January 1867...

A ration to consist of one pound and one quarter of beef, or three quarters of a pound of pork, eighteen ounces of bread or flour...

The prices of the several component parts of the ration shall be specified; but the United States reserve the right of making such alterations in the price of the component parts of the ration as shall make the price of each part thereof bear a just proportion to the proposed price of the whole ration.

It is understood that the contractor is to be at the expense and risk of issuing the supplies to the troops, and that all losses sustained by the depletions of an enemy, or by means of the troops of the United States shall be paid by the United States at the price of the articles captured or destroyed as aforesaid on the deposition of two or more persons of credible characters...

THE proposed contract shall be awarded under contracts now in force, have been consumed; and that a supply in advance may be always required at any of the fixed posts of the sea-board, or Indian frontier, not exceeding three months.
