of the government which, amount to thirteen millions per annum, and the privilegez of putting branches all over the Union, which gives their paper a more extensive circulation than any other, only divides ten per cent. per annum, while the small banks are dividing from 12 to 14 and 16 per cent; and lately the small bank of Delaware has divided 17 per cent. and the stock is this minute worth 80 per cent. advance.

Our bank projectors have recourse (1 am told) to the " Commercial dictionary," or the works of Noah Webster, (which is the same thing as if one was taken from the other) for information respecting banks-but excepting the date of the charters and the amount of capital there is nothing else worth knowing. As to the amount of dividends, one might as well consult the Alcoran, for they are wrong nine times out of ten.

It is not the amount of capital that givesistability to a bank. The Mechanics' Bank would do equally as much business, and with much more, safety and satisfaction on five hundred than on a million, for by allowing interest on the deposits she would force all the valuable deposits from the other banks, which would give her a capital at once.

It is really unfortunate that the friends to a bank could not settle the business about commissioners. Great names really give a sanction to schemes, which they are not entitled to, and as they do, ought, perhaps, to be made use of.
