WEW-YORK, MAY 21.

The ship Mary Ann left Bordeaux on the 20th of April; Paris papers of the 12tm, and a regular file of Borde ux papers to the 16th of that month, inclusive, are received at the office of the Mercantile Advertiser. Notwithstanding gigantic projects of aggrandizement are for ning, and although the continent of Europe is undergoing-an-important revolution, these papers are almost wholly destitute of interest.

We learn, verbally, that Prussia has declared war against Sweden; that the French were marching large armies towards European Turkey, from which quarter news of hostilities having commenced was shortly expected; and theb scarcely a doubt existed that Prussia had joined France in the war against England, or would do so shortly.

On the 6th of April the guardship in the harbour of Bordeaux, mounting 28 twelve pounders, and 110 men (on board of which were the papers of the brig Orient of New-York,) was cut out and captured by the boats of the Brilish frigate Iris. After the English nad taken possession of her, she was attacked by a French man of war brig, but without success; the latter was beaten off with the loss of several men.

A British squadron was blockuding Rochefort.

An embargo of ten days continuance was raised at Bordeaux on the 19th, the day before captain Barke sailed.

A decree had been i sued from the custom house at Bordeaux, in . hich, it was ordered, 1. That the importation of painted and white cotton cloths, muslins, and cotton yarn be probibited. 2. That the importation of raw cetton be subject to a duty of 60 francs decimal quintal, and spun cotton to 7 francs per killograme. 3. That spun cotton be admitted only through the offices at Antwerp, Cologne, Mayence, Shasburgh Bourglibre, and Verseix. 4. That a Drawback of 5%

SPAIN. MADRID, March 7.

In the night of the 26,n February, the f ur French frigates and two brigs which were in the port of Cadiz set sail, and contrived to deceive the vigdance of the English flect, which is crn.ing.off that port. As they have provisions on board for six mosths, it is presumed they have a distant destination.

Government has received advices with in these few days, that a conspiracy has been discovered at Caracas (on the Continent of America) the central point of which was the city of Paz. Seventeen the principal conspirators among whom were some functionaries of the State, were seized and executed. The wise measures which were taken, stifled in its birth a plot which might have been attended with the worst consequences.

# GERMANY.

LEIPSICK, March 28. The vague reports which have been spread upon the formation of a Kingdom of Saxony, seem to take more consistency. It is thought that the different Ducal Houses of Sexony, all issued from the Ernestine line, would willingly acknowledge the sovereignty of the Elector of Saxony, or of the Albertine line, reserving to themselves the full and entire enjoy ment of the revenues which they now draw from their respective possessions. The Count's of Reurs, of Schomburg and of Schwartzhurg, who are already in the dependence, ditter of the Elector or of the Dukes of Saxony, not only from the position of their Pri-cipalities, but even by different feudal ties, would gladly exchange a precarions dependence against the advantage of seeing their possessions better secured. In fine Prussia would cede the territory of Erfort aguinst the districts contiguous to the great mass of

The New Kingdom of Saxony would thus comprise the following states: Electorate of Saxony with Lusace, &c 1994 square leagues, 2,150,000 inhabitants; Saze Gotha, 144 square leagues, 165,000 inhabitants; Saxe Weymar, 99 square leagues, 114,000 inhabitants; Saxe Cobourg, 50 square leagues, 61,000 inhabitants; Sax Mainingen, 57 square leagues, 52.000 inhabitants : County of Schwartzbourg, 120 square leagues, . 100,000 inhabitants; County of Reuss, 58 square leagues, 70,000 inhabitants; County of Schoenbrun, 56 Laquare leagues, 52,000. inhabitants; territory of Ersort, 30 square-leagues, 42,000 inhabitants. All this would form a total mass of 2,850,000inhabitants, upon an extent of 2618 aquare leagues.
